



But getting that same blue light from the sun, which contains a health-boosting full spectrum of light, does the opposite. According to the study, the more daytime blue light a person gets, the better defense they have against the harms of evening blue light from screens. In other words, the more sunlight exposure a child gets during the day, the better their brain can build a wall against the harms of artificial blue light later.

However, according to Mike Tipton, a professor at University of Portsmouth, this is far from the quickest way of lowering your body temperature.

There are plenty of simple, scientifically supported techniques that will help you handle the heat. (①) If you're feeling the heat and somebody offers you a fan, it's likely that you'll try and cool your face first. (②) Certainly, all that breeze on your face will stimulate cold receptors there, which will give you a very powerful sensation of comfort.
